- History:

- History really only started 5,000 years ago when people first started to write and keep records.

# Why do we need to know history?


 Learning about the past helps us understand the present and make decisions about the future.

# Human History Timeline: 500 Years




## Why timelines?

 Chronology -- The arrangement of events or dates in the order in which they occurred.

- They help us understand change over time.
- They help us establish a chronology of events.
- Like a map helps you know where you are, a timeline can help you figure out when something was happening.
- This gives us valuable context which gives historical events meaning.

- February 4, 1817 Frederick Douglass is born
- March 6, 1857 Supreme Courts hands down decision in Dred Scott Case
- October 16, 1859 John Brown's Raid on Harper's **FerryS**
- issued
- December 18, 1865 Thirteenth Amendment proclaimed, ending slavery in the United States
- July 2, 1908Thurgood Marshall is born
- February 12, 1909 National Association for Colored July 2, 1964 Civil Rights Act of 1964 is signed into People is founded
- March 10, 1913 Harriet Tubman dies
- August 25, 1919George Wallce is born
- January 15, 1929 Martin Luther King Jr. is born
- February 19, 1942FDR signs Executive Order 9066
